To those joining us for the first time: you belong here. To those who have carried this work from the beginning: thank you—your labor is the reason we gather in strength and not in doubt.

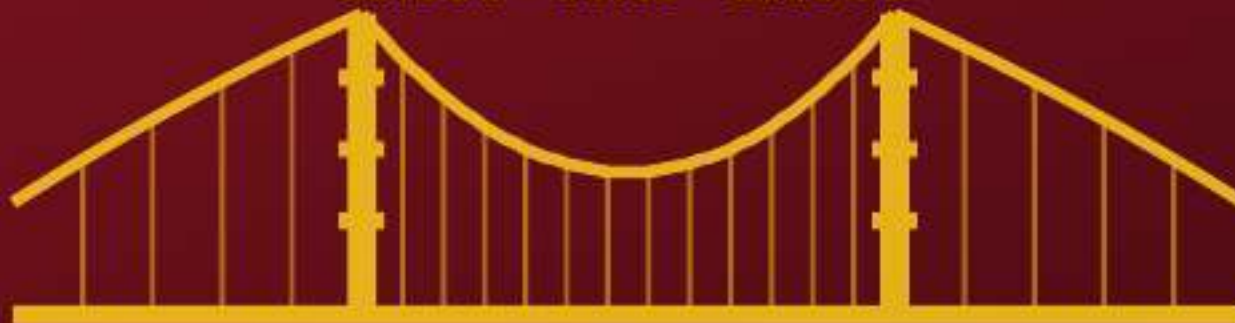

Meet the Speaker

President, Itsekiri National Congress, USA

“The bridge is built from both shores.”

Mr. Otse Amorighoye is the President of the Itsekiri National Congress, USA, and one of the driving forces behind its founding vision: a united Itsekiri diaspora working hand-in-hand with communities at home.

Under his leadership in Year One, INC-USA moved from words to works: telehealth centers in Ugbegbe and Jakpa, solar power and satellite internet installed, an emergency medical appeal delivered in six days with \$0 retained, and a community food drive for families back home.

His address will hold two realities side by side: the reality of our lives here in America, and the reality on the ground in our communities. “I implore everyone to visit our communities,” he says. “Each one requires its own independent solution. We have the most beautiful islands, with so much potential.”

Visiting changes what we build. In Jakpa, we might assume satellite internet is the greatest need — yet the community valued a reliable place to charge their phones even more. Internet still matters; the lesson is that solutions with real impact are designed on the ground, not from a distance.

He will also ask the harder questions. Our communities have clinics that are not functional — in Jakpa, an abandoned hospital stands alongside a newly built health center that has never opened. Why is it not functional — and who holds

government accountable: the diaspora, the community, or our leaders? There are good government initiatives, but too few are sustainable — and sustainability is the test every project must pass.

And he will call for bold ideas equal to the scale of the challenge: empowering our riverine fishing communities — even a community trawler through a public-private partnership; lobbying so the companies that operate in our region are more accountable to the people who live there; and rethinking systems that are clearly not benefiting everyday lives.

The situation is harder than it looks from the diaspora — but there is hope. His message to every member is simple: the bridge is built from both shores. Visit home. Back one effort. Adopt one project. And help it succeed.

Mr. Ade Mabo is a serial entrepreneur, mindset strategist, and philanthropist whose work spans North America and Africa. He has built a diverse portfolio of ventures across education technology, real estate, hospitality, agriculture, and consulting — and mentors others in wealth creation and personal development as a life coach known as “The Mindset Surgeon.”

He is the founder of the **Roli Mabo Foundation**, established in 2020, which delivers healthcare outreach, education intervention, youth entrepreneurship support, and environmental protection in remote riverine communities of the Niger Delta — the same creeks and communities at the heart of this Congress’s mission.

Through the Foundation he has championed public-private partnerships for sustainable development — taking doctors, medicines, school materials, and opportunity to families in the creeks who are too often left out of both.

His partnership with INC-USA on the “Bridging the Gap” community initiative — now live with telehealth, solar power, and internet access in

riverine Iwere Land — is a living example of this year’s theme in action.

Each pillar becomes a standing committee that reports back in 2027. The Communiqué is published within the week — to the membership, the palace, and every institution it names.

General Assembly — Saturday, September 5

Adoption & Ratification of the Constitution

Year Two builds institutions. The Constitution and Bylaws of the Itsekiri National Congress, USA — developed over the past year and comprising 26 articles — will be presented to the membership for adoption and ratification at the General Assembly. Copies will be available at registration and circulated to members ahead of the vote. Among its provisions: a democratic structure of national officers and regional chapters, and a two-term lifetime limit for Executive Committee offices.

Elections of National Officers

This convention year, the Congress holds elections. Following the adoption of the Constitution, the General Assembly will elect the National Executive Committee for the coming term:

When One of Ours Falls, the Rest of Us Close Ranks

How this Congress funded an emergency surgery in six days

\$12,385 RAISED · 170% OF GOAL	58 DONORS AROUND THE WORLD	6 DAYS FROM APPEAL TO SURGERY	\$0 RETAINED BY THE CONGRESS
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On the first Saturday of August, a young member of this Congress was travelling to a wedding in Nigeria when her vehicle collided with a truck — she never made it to the celebration. She survived — barely — with fractures that would not heal without surgery, and a hospital that could not schedule the operation until it was paid for.

The Congress opened an appeal the next morning. By that evening, fourteen members had given. By Tuesday, the goal was passed. By Thursday, the surgery was done. Gifts came from \$30 to \$2,500, from members across the United States, Canada and Nigeria — and many were carried on behalf of parents, cousins and friends at home who wanted to be part of it.

Every dollar received was sent to the family, at the fastest rate the bank allowed, with nothing held back. A daily accounting was published to the membership throughout.

What it taught us

This appeal worked because the community moved fast and trusted the process. It also showed us what we could build so the next emergency starts stronger: a standing **Emergency Assistance Fund**, and **group health coverage** for members and relatives residing in Nigeria. Both proposals are before you at this Convention.
